DID YOU KNOW?

- Divine Mercy Sunday is an observance in the Roman Catholic Church in which followers are encouraged to offer forgiveness and reconciliation and it occurs the Sunday after Easter.
- It is based on visions recorded from St. Faustian Kowalski.
 In 2000, it was decreed a solemnity, a high feast day, by
 Pope John Paul II. Roman Catholics are required to attend worship, go to confession, and take Holy Communion.
- In one vision Jesus asked her to paint the vision where he has one hand raised in blessing and with two fingers of his other hand resting on his heart, and to include a prayer "Jesus, I trust in you"
- Most priests preach on the story of Doubting Thomas on Divine Mercy Sunday. When Jesus arose from the dead, he didn't believe it, so Jesus directed him to touch his wounds. Jesus doesn't chastise Thomas for his disbelief, which is considered an act of mercy.
- The Message of Divine Mercy has always been near and dear to me... which I took with me to the See of Peter and which it in a sense forms the image of this Pontificate Pope John Paul II.

Angels informed onlookers that Jesus had risen. Throughout the next 40 days, Jesus appeared to his apostles and disciples before finally ascending to heaven. Easter is the highest and holiest of holidays in the Christian faith.
