

Drawing is on Dec 4th. As of Nov 4th, we sold 124.3 books. Final results will be included in the next Newsletter.






Dues Invoices will be sent out on Dec 15. Membership Dues should be paid by Jan 1st. We take cash, checks, and Venmo!





Christmas Fun Facts (Dec 24 Eve through Dec 25):

Christmas is the annual feast commemorating the birth of Jesus Christ. For Christians, it is not just a single day, but an extended season of joy and celebration, involving many traditions, music, and activities. Here are a few interesting things to know:

- When and how long is Christmas?
 - 4 Christmas Day, liturgically called "The Solemnity of the Nativity of the Lord", includes both Christmas Eve (Dec. 24, after sunset) and Christmas Day (Dec. 25).
- Was Jesus really born on Dec. 25?
 - Probably not! We simply do not and cannot know the exact day on which Jesus was actually born.
 - ♣ Jesus' birth has been celebrated on Dec. 25 since the 4th century when the Roman Empire adopted Christianity.
- What are the liturgical colors for Christmas?
 - The official liturgical color of the Christmas Season for most Churches is white or gold.
 - 4 Popular culture often associates Christmas with *greens* and *reds*, in addition to the use of white and silver, gold, or other shiny metallic colors (stars? bells? musical instruments?).
- What is a Manger Scene and where does this tradition come from?
 - 4 In the weeks before or during the Christmas season, many people set up a "manger scene" in their churches or homes, depicting the baby Jesus surrounded by Mary, Joseph, angels, shepherds, animals, and the wise men.
 - The Gospel of Luke says, "While they were in Bethlehem, the time came for Mary to have her child, and she gave birth to her firstborn son. *She wrapped him in swaddling clothes and laid him in a manger*, because there was no room for them in the inn." (Luke 2:6-7)
 - The tradition of displaying a crèche (manger) did not arise until the mid-12th century; it is attributed to St. Francis of Assisi, who wanted to emphasize the poor and humble circumstances in which Jesus was born.
