For decades Memorial Chalices were given to the families of faithfully departed 4th Degree members of the Knights of Columbus.



In recent years the practice has been replaced with monetary donations directed to a charity of the deceased family's choice.

Father Rogers Byambaasa has made a special request to the Knights of Columbus to help him give life to Memorial Chalices in our community.

Father has been the Chaplain at St Jospeh Hospital in Bloomington since 2013. He is currently assisting Father Loftus with Mass at Holy Trinity and Historic St Patrick until a new Priest is assigned.

Father Rogers is from Uganda, East Africa, and has a master's degree in human development counseling from Bradley University. He has taught English and Christian religious education in high schools and has served as a Pastor in Kenya. Prior to joining OSF St. Joseph, Father Rogers spent 12 years at OSF Saint Francis Medical Center in Peoria.

Dear Knights of the Diocese of Peoria and Friends,

On Monday November 18, 2024 an extensive fire damaged the home of David Garcia and father of seminarian Angel Garcia. The family has been temporarily hosted by family members in another home. Angel Garcia is a freshman at Immaculate Heart of Mary Seminary in Winona MN. Fr. Greg Nelson, newly assigned pastor at Holy Cross Parish, Mendota, has been mentoring Angel's vocation discernment for the last few years while he was serving as pastor of St. Mary's, Bloomington, IL. The Garcia family connection began with Fr. Greg, who is now the Chaplain of the Mendota Knights of Columbus Council. David Garcia currently teaches Spanish at St. Bede Academy, Peru, IL. and is supporting his wife Mayra and 2 younger children.

K of C Council 2090 is hosting an immediate emergency fundraising effort to replace the sudden loss of all clothing and relocation expenses for the Garcia's. The home may not be economically recoverable.

100% of all donations will be transferred to the Garcia family and will support the Diocese of Peoria seminarian program on behalf of Angel.



Christmas History:

Celebrating the birth of Jesus Christ, Christmas starts a 12-day season that begins on Dec 25th and ends on Jan 5th. Christmas services are on Christmas Eve and midnight masses.

While the holiday is religious, many cultures, celebrate this holiday. This often centers around Santa Claus, a mythical figure dressed in a red suit, based on Saint Nicholas. Tradition has it that on Christmas morning, Santa brings gifts for children who have been good and coal for those who are naughty.

Saint Nicholas Day

This day aims to recognize Saint Nicholas' contributions to the poor and his reputation for bringing gifts to those in need.

Saint Nicholas of Myra was born in the 3rd century. He became well known for his charitable nature and actions.

He would later become the inspiration for the jolly Santa Claus. Saint Nicholas Day is observed annually on December 6th.

St. John the Apostle Day

The Feast of St. John the Apostle commemorates his life. He was one Jesus' 12 disciples. He was one of the three disciples, which included Peter and James, who were included in some of the most important events in the life and ministry of Jesus Christ, including Jesus' crucifixion and transfiguration.

St John is known as the author of the Gospel of John, John I, II, and III, and the Revelation of John. However, the authorship of the works is disputed.



Eucharistic Miracle of

FERRARA

ITALY, 1171

This Eucharistic miracle took place in Ferrara, in the Basilica of Saint Mary in Vado, on Easter Sunday, March 28, 1171. While celebrating Easter Mass, Father Pietro da Verona, the prior of the basilica, reached the moment of breaking the consecrated Host when he saw blood gush from it and stain the ceiling vault above the altar with droplets. In 1595 the vault was enclosed within a small shrine and is still visible today in the monumental Basilica of Santa Maria in Vado.

On March 28, 1171, the prior of the Canons Regular Portuensi, Father Pietro da Verona, was celebrating Easter Mass with three confreres (Bono, Leonardo and Aimone). At the moment of the breaking of the consecrated Host, It sprung forth a gush of Blood that threw large drops on the small ceiling vault above the altar.

Histories tell of the "holy terror of the celebrant and of the immense wonder of the people who crowded the tiny church." There were many eyewitnesses who told of seeing the Host take on a bloody color and having seen in it the figure of a baby. Bishop Amato of Ferrara and Archbishop Gherardo of Ravenna were immediately informed of the event. They witnessed with their own eyes the miracle, namely "the Blood which we saw redden the altar ceiling vault." The church immediately became a pilgrim destination, and later was rebuilt and expanded on the orders of Duke Ercole d'Este beginning in 1495.

There are many sources regarding this miracle. Among the most important is the Bull of Pope Eugene IV (March 30, 1442), in which the pontiff mentions the miracle in reference to the testimonies of the faithful and ancient historical sources. The 1197 manuscript of Gerardo Cambrense, conserved in Canterbury's Lambeth Library is the oldest document that mentions the miracle. The miracle received recent attention in the "Gemma Ecclesiastica"

(Budding of the Church) by historian Antonio Samaritani. Another document which dates to March 6, 1404, is the Bull of Cardinal Migliorati, in which he grants indulgences to "those who visit the church and adore the Miraculous Blood." Even today, on the 28th day of every month in the basilica, which is currently under the care of Saint Gaspare del Bufalo's Missionaries of the Most Precious Blood, Eucharistic Adoration is celebrated in memory of the miracle. And every year, in preparation for the Feast of Corpus Christi, the solemn Forty

Hours devotion is celebrated. The eighth centenary of the Miracle was celebrated in 1971.

DECEMBER: The Immaculate Conception

The Feast of the Immaculate Conception is a Catholic Holy Day that is celebrated on Dec 8th. It celebrates the conception of the Virgin Mary in the womb of her mother – St. Anne.

Immaculate Conception of Mary is a profound mystery. Mary was without sin from the first moment of her conception. She is perfectly united forever to her spouse, the Holy Spirit. Their fruitful union produced a wedding of heaven and earth in the God-Man, Jesus Christ.
