Feast of the Presentation of the Lord:

The Church celebrates the Feast of the Presentation of the Lord on February 2, which occurs 40 days after the birth of Jesus and is also known as Candlemas Day, since the blessing and procession of candles is included in today's liturgy.

A light of revelation to the Gentiles, and glory for your people Israel. Lk 2:32

Mardi Gras:

Mardi Gras marks the end of the Carnival season observed by many Catholics. It starts at Epiphany on January 6 and ends on the Tuesday before Ash Wednesday. Mardi Gras is the last day before lent, which is a solemn period observed by prayer, repentance, fasting, and moderation. It is often associated with lavish Carnival-like celebrations.

Mardi Gras has been celebrated in the U.S since 1699. The first parade was in 1857 in the streets of New Orleans.

Ash Wednesday:

A Catholic observance in which ashes are marked on the forehead of parishioners in the shape of a cross. The ashes are meant as a reminder of our mortality and sinfulness.

It marks the beginning of Lent, a 40-day period that ends with Easter. This is a period observed by prayer, repentance, fasting, & moderation.

Sundays are excluded as they are considered a celebratory day that represents the resurrection of Jesus and the Sabbath day of rest.
