# June: Precious Blood of Christ

The blood of Christ saves us from sin. It is the blood of Christ that gives us the hope of heaven.

St. Paul tells us that Jesus reconciled "to himself all things, whether on earth or in heaven, making peace by the blood of his cross" (Col. 1:20).

Without the blood of Christ shed for us, all would be lost.

# Saint Thomas

St. Thomas was one of Jesus' disciples. He is perhaps best known for being the one who wanted proof of Jesus' resurrection. He is often referred to as Doubting Thomas, and also the name The Twin.

Many Christians see themselves in St. Thomas because he doubted the resurrection until he received proof from Christ. He also confessed to not understanding Jesus when Christ told his disciples at the Last Supper that he was preparing a place for them.

## Saint James

The feast day of James the Greater commemorates the life of Jesus' disciple. He was one of the inner circle of Jesus' followers and he witnessed the transfiguration of Christ and the raising of Jairus' daughter from the dead.

James was among the three disciples to see the transfiguration of Jesus. He, Peter, and John accompanied Jesus on a mountain where Jesus becomes radiant and is transfigured to light. The prophets Moses and Elijah appear and speak with Jesus (Matthew 17:1-9, Mark 9:2-8, Luke 9:28-36).

Of Jesus' 12 disciples, two were named James. This celebration centers on James the son of Zebedee, also known as James the greater.
