Lenten Season Tradition – Friday Fish Fry at KofC 574

BLOOMINGTON — It was just after 5 p.m. on a Friday night in Lent, the first Friday, actually, and the Catholic faithful were already gathering at the Knights of Columbus Council 574's banquet hall.

Carrying on a tradition older than any of them, they showed up at 1706 RT Dunn Drive in Bloomington for the seasonal fish fry for Fridays in Lent, a time when Catholics are asked not to eat meat in observance of the religious period leading up to Easter.

The kitchen was getting ready for service, with fish and shrimp ready for the fryer, made-from-scratch mac 'n' cheese and cornbread kept in the warmers and a smorgasbord of desserts, courtesy of the Ladies' Auxiliary.

Bob Fischer and Bev Roberts have been married for 40 years, and they've been attending the fish fry for as long as they can remember.

"I'd rather not say how many years," Fischer laughed. "I'm dating myself."

In fact, Roberts arrived early enough to be first in line and ensure that they both got a generous slice of pecan pie.

Tradition

The Knights of Columbus were founded by Father Michael J. McGivney in the 1880s in New Haven, Connecticut, said Jim Smith.

Smith is the Grand Knight of Council 574, the highest-ranking member.

"Our mission is to support the parishes, the priests, the schools and the Catholic community of Bloomington-Normal, this council and the other two — they're supporting their parishes and their priests," he said.

With tens of thousands of councils worldwide, Council 574 is one of the oldest in Illinois, if not the world, Smith said.

"This council was formed in 1903 ... we've been doing fish probably as long (as that)," Smith said.

On an average Friday in Lent, Council 574 goes through about 100 pounds of whitefish and serves anywhere between 120 and 260 people, Smith said.

And it's all cooked fresh in their industrial kitchen as the throngs of hungry celebrants line up.

"I think these fish fries just came about as a way to support the community," Smith said. "Because that's what we do."

Sometimes, with long-standing traditions, minor changes or stylistic nuances can pop up over the years. For Council 574's fish fries, though, besides a brief interruption during the COVID-19 pandemic, it hasn't changed a bit. In his quarter century with the council, they've changed "Not at all," Smith said.

Despite the cost of food rising and inflation causing people to pinch pennies every which way, Smith has only had to raise prices for the fish fry \$2 in his four years as Grand Knight, he said.

"This is a charitable event," he said. "We're not here to make a profit. We're just here to provide a meal for the Catholic community."

But you certainly don't have to be Catholic to sit at the table.

Good upbringing

Mike and Jan Buttitta have been married for 27 years this coming May.

And while her husband was making the mac 'n' cheese last week, Jan Buttitta was getting her teenaged grandson, Oliver Rogers, ready to fill plates.

It's a family tradition, cooking and serving other, Jan Buttitta said.

"It's great," she said. "They come (out), and then they come back. Because it's just fun."

Three generations of the Buttitta family were present during last week's fish fry: the patriarch and matriarch, their daughter Madelaine Rogers, and her son, who also brought a friend.

What motivates the Buttitta family to volunteer?

"Good upbringing," Mike Buttitta said, laughing.

"Just know we're doing the work that we're supposed to be doing. We're helping our brothers and sisters in what they're doing. We're here to help," he said. "That's what we do."

His wife brought it back to their faith, though.

"That's what Christ would want us to do. That's the way we were taught. That's how he taught his disciples," she said. "It just carries on."

Fish on

Steve Montgomery, even though he's a plumber by trade, is the head cook at Council 574. He's been there for about eight years and enjoys every minute of it.

"I've always wanted to cook," he said, coating the whitefish with his signature breading. "I've been cooking since I was 10 years old."

Growing up in restaurants, Montgomery said he's always had a passion for cooking. Tying that in with serving his Catholic family is just natural for him.

"People enjoy eating it. We enjoy getting our time to do it," he said.

And if there's any secret to Montgomery's fish recipe, he's keeping his lips sealed.


"A couple things," he grinned. "Everybody does it a little different."

Secret recipe or no, Fischer and Roberts enjoy every meal they get.

"As long as they've had the fish fries, we've come. And it's for a good cause." Fischer said. Then he leaned in as if telling a secret that could get him into trouble.

"And we don't have to cook on Friday nights," he said.

MIRACLES OF THE WORLD

"I am the living bread that came down from heaven; whoever eats this bread will live forever; and the bread that I will give is my flesh for the life of the world." (John 6:51-52)

Eucharistic miracles have occurred throughout our history. A Eucharistic miracle involves the body and blood of the Eucharist taking on biological qualities of Christ's blood, flesh, or both. These extraordinary events have helped people see the spiritual reality of God behind the physical world, reminding us there is more to our existence than we can understand with our 5 senses alone. (a Monthly Series)



In Alatri's Cathedral of Saint Paul the Apostle is kept even today the reliquary of the Eucharistic miracle that occurred in 1228 and consisted in a fragment of the Host turning into flesh. A young woman, in an effort to regain the love of her sweetheart, consulted a sorceress who ordered her to steal a consecrated Host to make a love potion. During Mass, the young woman hid a Host in a cloth. But when she got home, she realized that the Host had been transformed into bleeding flesh. This miracle has extensive documentation, including from Pope Gregory IX.

The most authoritative testimony regarding this miracle is found in the Bull "Fraternitastuae" (March 13, 1228) written by Pope Gregory IX in response to Bishop Giovanni V of Alatri. Here is the text: "Gregory, Bishop and Servant of the Servants of God, to Venerable Brother Bishop of Alatri, greetings and Apostolic blessing. We have received your letter, dearest brother, in which you informed us of a certain young woman misguided by an evil woman, who, after having received from the priest the Most Holy Body of Christ, held it in her mouth until the right moment to conceal it in a cloth. After three days, she discovered the same Body which she had received in the form of bread transformed into flesh, as everyone has been able to verify with their own eyes. Because both women have humbly revealed this to you, you desire our opinion regarding the punishment that should be imposed on them. First, we give thanks with all our strength to Him who, though He always operates in marvelous ways, in this case repeats miracles and produces new wonders so that He calls to sinners, converts evil doers, and confounds heretics while strengthening faith in the truth of the Catholic Church, sustaining hope and re-igniting charity.

Thus, dearest brother, by means of this apostolic letter, we dispose that you inflict a milder punishment on the young woman, whom we hold to have done this more from weakness than malice, especially because it can be believed that she has sufficiently repented in confessing her sin. To the instigator, who with her perversion pushed the young woman to commit sacrilege, apply those disciplinary measures that we believe opportune to leave to your judgment. She should also visit the nearest bishops so that she can humbly confess her crime, imploring pardon with devout submission." The Pope interpreted this episode as a sign against the widespread heresies regarding the Real Presence of Jesus in the Eucharist and pardoned the two repentant women. A commemorative medal was coined on the 750th anniversary of the miracle; one side showed the cathedral façade and the reliquary, while the other a bust of Pope Gregory IX with the Bull.
