




There were many witnesses who saw the miracle, and very soon the news spread throughout the whole nation. The Emperor Maximilian I himself was very devoted to it.


Today one can visit the Church of St. Oswald where the precious relic of the Host, stained with blood, is exposed, and also view many paintings depicting the miracle.



Ascension History

DID YOU KNOW?

The Observance of Ascension marks Jesus Christ's ascent into heaven. After his crucifixion and resurrection, biblical narratives detail how he ascended to heavenly realms in the presence of his disciples. It signifies the conclusion of his earthly ministry, the glorification of the resurrected Christ, and anticipates his second coming. This event offers spiritual lessons like the establishment of human dignity and divine promise.

A story about a small town's efforts to create an outdoor nativity scene illustrates this point. A Protestant minister said to the local Catholic priest, "We can include all the characters mentioned in the Bible, except we should leave Mary out. Otherwise, the scene will appear to be too Catholic." The priest responded, "I'll agree to that on the condition that you explain to everyone how the infant Jesus was born without a mother."

> Despite its origins in the 1st century AD, across the Atlantic, the Ascension observance found its place in American Christianity, gradually becoming intertwined with its religious landscape. The significance resonates with American Christians mainly through the theological promise of believers' own future ascension, instilling both hope and encouragement. Moreover, it greatly influences the themes of various Christian-oriented systems, activities, and media.

Catholics are indeed known for the honor they give to the Virgin Mary, and she plays an irreplaceable role in God's plan of salvation. It is only right that we honor her (not worship her), for one of the Commandments says, "Honor your father and mother". If God wants us to honor our parents, how much more must he desire us to honor his Mother. The angel Gabriel declared Mary to be "full of grace", making her worthy of our highest respect. Mary herself stated that "all ages will call me blessed".

In America, the Observance of Ascension is traditionally marked on a Thursday, forty days after Easter Sunday, symbolizing the period Jesus spent with his disciples postresurrection. However, some regions move it to the following Sunday for practical reasons. Observances generally include church services, scripture readings, processions, and prayers. Often, sermons focus on the profound importance of Christ's ascension and its implications for Christians today. This special day reminds followers of their divine mission on earth and assures them of heavenly glory.

The Catholic Church is virtually unique in obeying and fulfilling this scriptural prophecy.

Pentecost History

Trinity Sunday History

Pentecost commemorates when Jesus sent the Holy Spirit to be with the disciples (Acts 2). With the Holy Spirit among the disciples, the church was born. Pentecost is a Christian festival that celebrates the gift of the Holy Spirit. The day used to be known as Whitsun, a Christian holiday. The festival is generally full of good spirits. Ministers will wear red robes as a symbol of the flames in which the Holy Spirit came to Earth. Symbolism is important on the day. The Holy Spirit is the third part of the Trinity (Father, Son, and Holy Spirit) which Christians use as a way to interpret God. In essence, Pentecost is the birthday of the Christian faith.

Trinity Sunday is a Christian observance dedicated to the celebration and contemplation of the Holy Trinity, the divine nature of God as three distinct yet unified persons: Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. This theological concept is considered essential to understanding the nature of God within Christianity, and the day serves as a focused acknowledgement of this central belief. Though not directly mentioned in the Bible, the Trinity became an official doctrine during the council meetings of the Church in the fourth century.

> The holiday takes place on the Sunday 50 days after Easter. Today, Pentecost is not widely celebrated as a religious day, but instead as a secular public holiday. It gives workers in many industries the day off. The name Pentecost comes from the Greek pentekoste meaning fiftieth.

The observance of Trinity Sunday dates back to the 10th century in some regions, but it was officially instituted by Pope John XXII in 1334. Over time, the celebration of the Trinity spread to various countries and denominations, including Roman Catholic, Anglican, and Lutheran churches. Within the United States, Trinity Sunday marks the beginning of the extended time known as Ordinary Time, which lasts until the start of Advent in late November or early December.

Trinity Sunday takes place on the first Sunday following Pentecost, a Christian observance occurring 50 days after the resurrection of Jesus during Easter. The exact date of Trinity Sunday varies each year, dependent upon the date of Easter, which in turn is based on the lunar calendar.
