The ADVENT Season (Nov 28 through the afternoon of Dec 24):

Advent is the liturgical season that precedes and prepares us for Christmas. While we typically regard Advent as a joyous season, it is also intended to be a period of preparation, much like Lent. Prayer, penance and fasting are appropriate during this season. Sundays during Advent should not be given to fasting, but instead to celebration because we celebrate the resurrection of Our Lord every Sunday.

- When and how long is Advent?
 - The Advent Season begins 4 Sundays before Christmas.
 - Advent ends on the afternoon of Dec. 24, since that evening, Christmas Eve begins. 4
- What does the word "Advent" mean?
 - 4 Advent refers to the coming of Christ and the liturgical period before Christmas.
- What are the traditional colors of Advent?
 - ↓ In the Roman Catholic Church, the official liturgical color for most of Advent is violet. Only on the 3rd Sunday is a rose (pink) colored candle lit, as a symbol of joy.
- What is an Advent Wreath?
 - Churches and families prominently display an evergreen wreath with four candles throughout the Advent Season.
 - 4 It is traditionally made of evergreens, symbolizing the continuation of life.
 - 4 Advent wreaths traditionally include three purple/violet candles and one pink/rose-colored candle.
 - 4 One purple candle is lit the 1st week, 2 the 2nd week, 3 the 3rd week, and all 4 during the 4th week of Advent; the growing light signifies the birth of Jesus, the light of the world.
